Government fails on foreign policy

Our government is failing at representing us in foreign policy. In Palestine, a genocide is taking place: War crimes, apartheid, and the wiping out of families by the Israeli regime. The Irish people unequivocally support Palestine in opinion polls. It is angering to see the Taoiseach sit on the fence.

From one side, we hear milquetoast appeals for Israel to cease collective punishment in Gaza with respect to international law.

From the other, Mr Varadkar talks of Israel being the closest to a democracy in the Middle East, states that it has the right to defend itself against 'brutal, savage' enemies and refuses to grant the same protections to Palestinian refugees as were given to Ukrainian refugees.

His party is also the only one across the political spectrum that blocked the Occupied Territories Bill.

We must be wary of the government's attempt to align itself with Western powers and must hold them to account for their stance on Palestine. Ireland, as a post-colonial state, should not forget its history. Our solidarity must extend to all oppressed people around the world.






 Working with the USI on a motion against Proctorio which will be discussed at the December National Council. <u>Here is a supporting</u> document.

9. VOTER REGISTRATION

All credit goes to Ella Mac Lennan, Citizenship Officer, for the below text.

A constitutional referendum on gender equality is scheduled for next year (date TBC), and local & EU elections will take place in June 2024. To ensure you have your say, register to vote here now - it only takes a few minutes. You will need your PPSN and Eircode - if you do not have a PPSN, complete the relevant form here.

Even if you do not hold Irish citizenship, you are still eligible to vote in local elections. In addition to this, British citizens can vote in Dáil elections, and EU

citizens can vote in EU elections. First time EU registrants wishing to vote in Ireland must complete an <u>EP1</u> declaration form to prevent double voting.

You may only be registered at one address - students who are already registered or wish to register at their home address may apply for a <u>postal vote</u>. You may also apply for postal vote if you cannot go to your polling station due to illness or disability. The deadline for all postal vote applications is 22 working days before polling day. If you register for postal vote, you cannot vote in person.

You may pre-register to vote if you are 16 or over. Your name will be added to the live register when you turn 18.
