## **Housing Campaign**











- Sign the <u>petition</u> to abolish the restrictive and paternalistic overnight guests policy.
- I submitted an <u>FOI on Circuit Laundry</u> which I received back and can be accessed here.
- Motion on overnight guests policy <u>passed</u> the 21st of November 2023
   Council and myself and Welfare Officer Aoife Bennett met with the Junior Dean on the 4th of December 2023 where a possible solution was proposed.
- TCD Renters' Network has been set up and has reached more than 100 members after flyering and social media push, please join if you rent on-campus or at Halls! On the 8th of December 2023 we had a meeting

with 15 in attendance where we discussed campaigns such as overnight guests policy and actions such as rent strike.

- Met Martin Leahy on the 25th of January 2024.
- We also launched our <u>Housing Survey Report</u> on the 25 of January 2024 with Housing Rights Officer Siubhán Stockman earning national <u>media</u> <u>attention</u>.
- With the TCD Renters' Solidarity Network we <u>flyered</u> on the 27th of January 2024.
- We did a banner drop on the 31st of January 2024, and an <u>FM104</u>
   <u>interview</u> as well as <u>College press</u> around it as well as talking to politicians.
- I attended the follow-up DDPA workshop on the 31st of January 2024 where I presented the TCDSU Housing Survey report.

## **Masters' Fees**

- If you are interested in applying for a masters' degree after finishing your bachelors, I urge you to read this and get involved in the campaign. There is a College proposal to hike one-year masters' degree fees. Let's take action. Nothing must be off the table. We must target the reputation and finances of the College, and make it impossible for them to increase fees.
- I met with Declan Coogan from the Global Office on the 31st of January 2024 to secure their support for the masters' fees issue.
- Discussion item on this is coming to the February 6th Council.

- We organised another flag drop including in student accommodations on the 29th of November 2023.
- We occupied Trinity's Regents House overnight on the 29th of November 2023 and earned <u>national media coverage</u>, with a follow up meeting on the 4th December 2023.
- I met with Academics for Palestine TCD at their December 8th 2023 meeting where we agreed to collaborate on a mapping project.
- We published our statement <u>"Trinity Cannot be Neutral" on the 8th of January 2024.</u>
- We began the process of ending our contract with Domino's at the earliest possible date on the 11th of January 2024.

- We published the "Report on Palestine within Humanities curricula in Trinity College Dublin" on 18th of January 2024.
- I attended the Healthcare Workers' solidarity letter action at the Dáil on the 25th of January 2024, and TCD students are also involved in this campaign.
- In direct <u>response</u> to us cutting ties with Dominos, they removed the pro-IDF posts on the 1st of February 2024.

## Campaigns Committee/Town Hall #2 and #3














## **Atrium Spaces**


• Together with the Chair of CSC and Disability Service Director and DUNES we checked out the Atrium spaces for possible improvements.


## **State of College Counselling and College Health Report**

Have you ever wondered why it takes so long to get an appointment? Or if
there's ever enough staff in our health services? The research paper
authored by the TCDSU titled <u>State of College Counselling and College</u>
<u>Health</u> contains never-before-seen statistics about these services, in terms
of staffing, waiting lists and usage. We have listened to student voices
about the issues of long waiting times and will be advocating for this in
meetings. It is clear from the research that more investment is needed in
these services.

## 1.4 Referendum

In my manifesto I stated that I will reform 1.4, the apolitical bit, in the
union allowing us to take more political action. After bringing it to Council
on 21st November, it was defeated, so we collected the required 500
signatures in less than 6 days, meaning that it will go to referendum. This
will give a chance for students to decide if they want our union to be able
to take more political stances.

## 9. VOTER REGISTRATION

All credit goes to Ella Mac Lennan, Citizenship Officer, for the below text.

Two constitutional referenda on the role of the mother and of the family are scheduled for March 8th 2024, and local & EU elections will take place in June 2024. To ensure you have your say, register to vote <a href="here">here</a> now - it only takes a few minutes. You will need your PPSN and Eircode - if you do not have a PPSN, complete the relevant form <a href="here">here</a>.

Even if you do not hold Irish citizenship, you are still eligible to vote in local elections. In addition to this, British citizens can vote in Dáil elections, and EU citizens can vote in EU elections. First time EU registrants wishing to vote in Ireland must complete an <u>EP1</u> declaration form to prevent double voting.

You may only be registered at one address - students who are already registered or wish to register at their home address may apply for a <u>postal vote</u>. You may also apply for postal vote if you cannot go to your polling station due to illness or disability. The deadline for all postal vote applications is 22 working days before polling day. If you register for postal vote, you cannot vote in person.

You may pre-register to vote if you are 16 or over. Your name will be added to the live register when you turn 18.
