Independent auditors' report to the board of management of Trinity College Dublin Students Union

We have audited the financial statements of Trinity College Dublin Students Union for the year ended 30 June 2016 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies of the Union.

Responsibilities of auditors

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the board in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Union's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We conducted our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

In our opinion the financial statements, prepared under the historical cost convention, as amended by the accounting policy for fixed assets, give a true and fair view of the state of the Union's affairs as at 30th June 2016 and of its results for the year then ended.

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of these accounts are as follows:

(a) Convention

The accounts have been prepared under the principles of the historical cost convention.

(b) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are written off in the period of acquisition, in accordance with the capitation policy of the Union.

(c) Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost or net realisable value, whichever is the lower.

(d) Income and Expenditure

Income is accounted for on a revenue earned basis and expenditure is accounted for on an expenditure incurred basis. Full provision is made for prepayments and accruals at the period end.
