My Experience

THEATRE EDITOR
I kept the section alive through the pandemic when theatres were closed and the sector was struggling. I also worked to understand how to use an online presence.

DEPUTY RADIUS EDITOR

Transparency

Welfare

Student welfare is a major issue. I want to implement more supports for staff writers who need them.

- More casual interactions including tea in the office, game evenings, and drinks evenings to celebrate occasions
- More training on good allyship with organisations such as TENI, BelongTo, and others
- Regular check-ins with students and better collaborations with the welfare roles in the paper such as the LGBTQ+ correspondent
