Manifesto: Ciara Ní Mhurchú

Is mise Ciara Ní Mhurchú agus ba mhaith liom a bheith i m'ionadaí iarchéime ar choiste na Gaeilge. Is mac léinn PhD mé, déanaim staidéar ar fhilíocht na Gaeilge ón seachtú haois déag.
