Who am I?

I'm **Conor Reddy**, President of PWO Ireland and PG rep to Council for 2022/23. I'm a PhD researcher in the School of Medicine (TTMI-St James') and I've been at Trinity since I began my undergraduate degree in 2014. As a PWO member, I have campaigned for the recognition of PhD researchers as workers, in keeping with a growing number of research leading European countries, and for improvements to pay and conditions for all PGRs. I was a contributor to the recent National Review on State Supports for PhD Researchers and I have played a central role in building a trade union for PhDs in Ireland since 2019.

What will I do?

My primary goal is to stand, strongly and entirely, for workers' rights, a living wage, parental leave, sick leave, reform for non-EU and disabled PG Researchers.

Having spent almost a decade in Trinity, I understand how the university works and will fight for all PGs - research and taught.

In addition to advocating for PGRs, I will use my position to advocate for more PG-appropriate, affordable housing, for improvements to PG study and leisure space and for greater representation for PGs at every level of university life.

Why PGR Rights?

PGRs are the researchers, teachers, markers and invigilators underpinning Trinity research and teaching but we are totally devalued. Treated as students, rather than workers we are denied the basic rights guaranteed to our colleagues across the university. Today we are at crisis point, paid below minimum wage and with no recourse but to organise and fight.
